Of notable significance was the student's involvement in a pivotal panel discussion titled "Youth Contribution Towards Sustainable Innovative Solutions". This panel was skillfully moderated by esteemed professionals, including Prof. Tarek El Sheikh, the Director of the Urban Training and Studies Institute at HBRC, and Prof. Mohamed Fathy, the Head of the Smart Cities Code Committee.

During the discussion, the student presented a project focused on Waste Management, garnering attention and interest from the audience.

# Plastic Production from Biomass by Dr. Irene Samy

The magazine "Techno Energy" featured Dr. Irene Sami for her innovation in creating 100% organic biodegradable plastic. This technology involves manufacturing plastic from crustaceans, aiming to reduce the carbon footprint resulting from this environmentally polluting industry.



Dr. Irene conducted a feasibility study to determine the volume of waste generated from crustaceans in Egypt. This helped assess the potential use of bio-based plastic as a substitute for conventional plastic. The study on plastic production from biomass received financial support through a joint grant between Nile University in Egypt and the University of Nottingham in London.

Dr. Irene Sami stated that the traditional plastic manufacturing process emits significant carbon emissions, primarily due to the use of certain types of oils, contributing to an increased carbon footprint in the air. She explained that the plastic industry has witnessed significant advancements recently, with various types of plastics available. However, the ubiquity of plastic as the main material in the production and packaging of most products makes it impossible to completely eliminate.





Before that, he pursued his bachelor's degree in pharmacy and biotechnology at the German University in Cairo, Egypt (2014), followed by a master's degree in molecular biology at the International Max Planck Research School in Göttingen, Germany (2016). Dr. El-Brolosy has received recognition for his work, including the Max Birnstiel Award (2019), the Otto Hahn Medal (2021), the Peter Hans Hofschneider Prize (2021), the Elisabeth-Gateff-Prize from the German Genetics Society (2021), and the Bayer Pharmaceuticals Award from the German Society of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology (2022). He was also listed in the 2020 Forbes Under 30 list, and the 2020 MIT Under 35 Innovators list for the MENA region.


